Checklist: How to Detect a Leak that Requires Water Line Repair in Atlanta GA?

Here's a quick checklist to help you detect leaks that may require water line repair:

1. **Take a hard look at your utility bill.** If your meter shows your water usage has suddenly surged and your bill is a lot higher than usual, yet there's been no change in how much water you and your family use, you probably have a leak somewhere. Reach out to your plumbing company so their experts can quickly track down the source of the surge.
2. **Do a toilet test.** Yes, it sounds weird, but this simple trick is an excellent way to find out if you have a leak. Take a few drops of food coloring, and drop them into your toilet tank located behind your toilet. You'll know that you have a leak if the food coloring appears in the toilet bowl. Simply changing out the toilet flapper may fix the issue, but you'll want to seek advice from a plumber if that doesn't work. You can also check for toilet leaks by listening for running water.
3. **Stalk your water meter.** Read the meter during a time of day when you're not running the water. Check back in a couple of hours and read the meter again. If it's moved, there's a leak somewhere. If you're unsure how to read a meter, speak with your plumbing company so they can help or check out the meter for you.
4. **Check underneath your kitchen appliances like refrigerators and dishwashers, keeping an eye out for pooling water.** You should also check underneath the sink for standing water located near the sink pipes. Edges and joints that are rusted are also proof that they've been sitting in water at some point, providing evidence of a leak.
5. **Keep an eye out for leaks inside your home.** Examine walls, flooring and ceilings for signs of mold and mildew. Finding these unpleasant contaminants in your home tends to be proof that pipes are leaking somewhere.
